Among the most fascinating experiences at Saffire Freycinet, we'll treasure our memories of our private nature walk with Mick, a local Aboriginal naturalist deeply in love with his country, as well as our visit to a nearby oyster farm. At the farm, we donned full waders and walked to a table situated offshore to begin shucking oysters, an experience complimented by chilled champagne.

Even if your time "down under" is limited, don't overlook Tasmania. Our three days in Tasmania were by far our favorite part of this fiveweek Australian adventure.

What did you enjoy most about traveling with other families?


